- Tell me about a time your performance was criticized.
- Tell us about a situation in which you had to adjust to changes over which you had no control. How did you handle it?
- Give me a specific example of a time when you had to conform to a process or policy with which you did not agree. What was the situation and how did you ensure compliance?

Collaboration, Teamwork, or Group Dynamics:

- Tell me about an experience you've had working on a team. What role do you tend to play when working on a team?
- What has been the most rewarding experience working with others?
- Tell me about a time that you had a conflict with a team member and how you handled it.
- Tell me about a time you had to build a relationship with someone you didn't like.
- Tell me about a time when you were upset with the behavior of a team member or supervisor and how you dealt with it.

Health Care Ethics & Societal Issues:

- Describe a time where you encountered any moral or ethical dilemmas to date. What happened and how was it resolved?
- What makes health care so expensive?
- How should society deal with the problem of child abuse?
- What do you feel are the social responsibilities of a healthcare provider?
- How do you feel prepared to meet the diverse needs of a multiethnic, multicultural patient population?

- To what extent do you owe a debt to those less fortunate than yourself? Please explain.
- You are taking a test and notice the person sitting next to you is copying answers from your paper. What do you do? Why?
- A patient brings you a very expensive present. What would you do? Why?

Questions to Consider Asking Your Professional School Interviewers

(<u>If</u> provided the opportunity and <u>not</u> provided on their official admissions website/application materials.)

To demonstrate your level of interest in pursuing professional education, you should be fully prepared to ask the interviewer(s) questions. While doing this, avoid asking questions on material already covered in the professional healthcare school websites or brochures. Intelligent and insightful questions will help demonstrate your most "professional self."

Overall, anticipate that some professional schools <u>might</u> provide you with time to ask them questions. If they ask, consider some various questions below to customize for your top professional schools. If an admissions committee member asks you for this prompt, please be prepared.

"Do you have any questions for us?"

Questions for Professional Schools: *Audience – Program Faculty & Administrators* Professional Curriculum & Academic Environment:

- Are there any special programs for which this program is noted for?
- What would a typical 1st year academic workload look like?
- Please tell me more about the integrated curriculum.
- What modalities are used for student lectures?
- What are the opportunities for research? What are the policies for taking time off for research opportunities?
- Does your professional school award letter grades or is it a pass/fail grading culture?
- Are there opportunities for students to design, conduct, and publish their own research?
- How do students get assistance if an academic need arises?
- Is there flexibility in the coursework (the number of electives) and the timing of the courses (accelerating, decelerating, and time off) during the pre-clinical and clinical years?
- Has this (specific) professional school, or any of its clinical departments, been on probation or had its accreditation revoked in the past?

• How do students from this medical school perform on the National Board Examinations? How does the school assist students who do not pass?

Questions for Professional Schools: *Audience – Program Faculty & Administrators* Professional Community, Services & Learning Environment:

- Do you offer an orientation/mentoring program for 1st year professional school students?
- How would you describe the campus atmosphere?
- How would you describe a typical entering class?
- What kind of support system could I expect to find if I were to attend this institution?
- How responsive is the school administration to student feedback? Can you give me an example?
- Would you characterize your classes as more competitive or cooperative?
- How would you characterize the school's philosophy?
- What types of counseling and student support does your program offer?
- What kind of academic, personal, financial, and career counseling is available to students? Are these services also offered to their spouses and dependents/children?
- How diverse is the student body? Are there support services or organizations specifically for ethnic/cultural minorities, LGBTQIA students, and women?
- Tell me about the library and extracurricular facilities (i.e., housing, dining, recreational/athletic facilities, etc.). Is designated study space available?
- What type of clinical sites—ambulatory, private preceptors, private hospitals, rural settings, international—are available or required for clerkships? Does this school allow students to do rotations at other institutions or internationally?
- What medical school committees (e.g., curriculum committee) have student representation?
- Are students involved in (required or voluntary) community service?
- How active is the student council/government? Are there other active student organizations affiliated with your professional school?
- Is there a mentor/advisor system? Who are the advisors—faculty members, other students, or both?
- What kind of academic, personal, financial, and career counseling is available to students? Are these services also offered to their spouses?
- Does this school provide vaccinations against Hepatitis B or prophylactic AZT treatment in case of a needle-stick or accident?
- In your view, what is the greatest strength of your program?
- What do you feel makes this institution unique?

Questions for Professional Schools: Audience – *Program Faculty & Administrators* Evaluations, Board Pass Rates, Accreditation, Residency / Fieldwork Experiences:

- How are students evaluated academically? How are clinical evaluations performed?
- Is there a formal mechanism in place for students to evaluate their professors and attending physicians? What changes have been made recently because of this feedback?

- How do students from this medical school perform on the National Board Examinations? How does the school assist students who do not pass?
- Has this medical school, or any of its clinical departments, been on probation or had its accreditation revoked?
- What type of clinical sites ambulatory, private preceptors, private hospitals, rural settings — are available or required? Does this school allow students to do rotations at other institutions or internationally?
- What are typical residency programs to which recent graduates were accepted?
- What kind of assistance will be available to me in identifying sites for residencies?
- What type of clinical exposure may I expect here?

Questions for Professional Schools: *Audience – Program Financial Aid/Scholarship Officers*

Financial Planning, Aid & Scholarships:

- What are the current tuition and fees? Is this expected to increase yearly? If so, at what rate is anticipated?
- Are there students who have an "unmet need" factor in their budget? If so, how do these students come up with the extra funds?
- Are there stable levels of federal financial aid and substantial amounts of university/medical school endowment aid available to students?
- Are spouses and dependents/children covered in a student's budget?
- Are there services/staff available to assist students with budgeting and financial planning?
- Does this school provide guidance to its students and to its graduates/alumni, on debt management?
- Is a car necessary? Is parking a problem to access campus or other professional school facilities?
- Is there budgeting & financial planning assistance?
